

Booking a Tour of Pelican Point Power Station.

Part 1: What do I need to know?

When does the Tour operate?

The tour runs every **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**, from the 3rd week in January to the 2nd week in December. Bookings may occasionally be available on other days by negotiation but please do not rely on this when planning your Term or Holiday activities.

What times are tours available?

Tours run three times a day:

9:30 – 11:00 11:15 – 12:45 1:00 – 2:30

How many students can I bring?

The tour is available for up to 30 students at a time.

What is the cost?

The tour is completely **free** – International Power bears all costs of running the tour program. You will only need to cover your transport expenses.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

International Power and Mobile Science Education take their **Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare** obligations very seriously. For this reason, there is a **strict dress code** for anyone attending tours at Pelican Point. The dress code applies to any teachers, volunteers, drivers, etc, who may be attending as well as the students.

Please take the time to read the dress code on the final page of this document and inform your students/staff that they will be denied entry if they do not meet the dress code.

Where is it?

Pelican Point Power Station is at the end of Pelican Point Road, Outer Harbour. A map can be found on the next page.

Can I use public transport?

Pelican Point Road is not serviced by public transport – it is a long road to walk down, and an even longer walk to a train station or bus stop. We strongly recommend either hiring a bus, using the school bus if one is available, or enlisting helpful parents to help out with transport.

Part 2: How do I make a booking?

Step 1

Contact Lee Harrison at Mobile Science Education to book your date(s) and time(s).

Step 2

You will be sent a confirmation letter by post or email confirming that your visit is booked in.

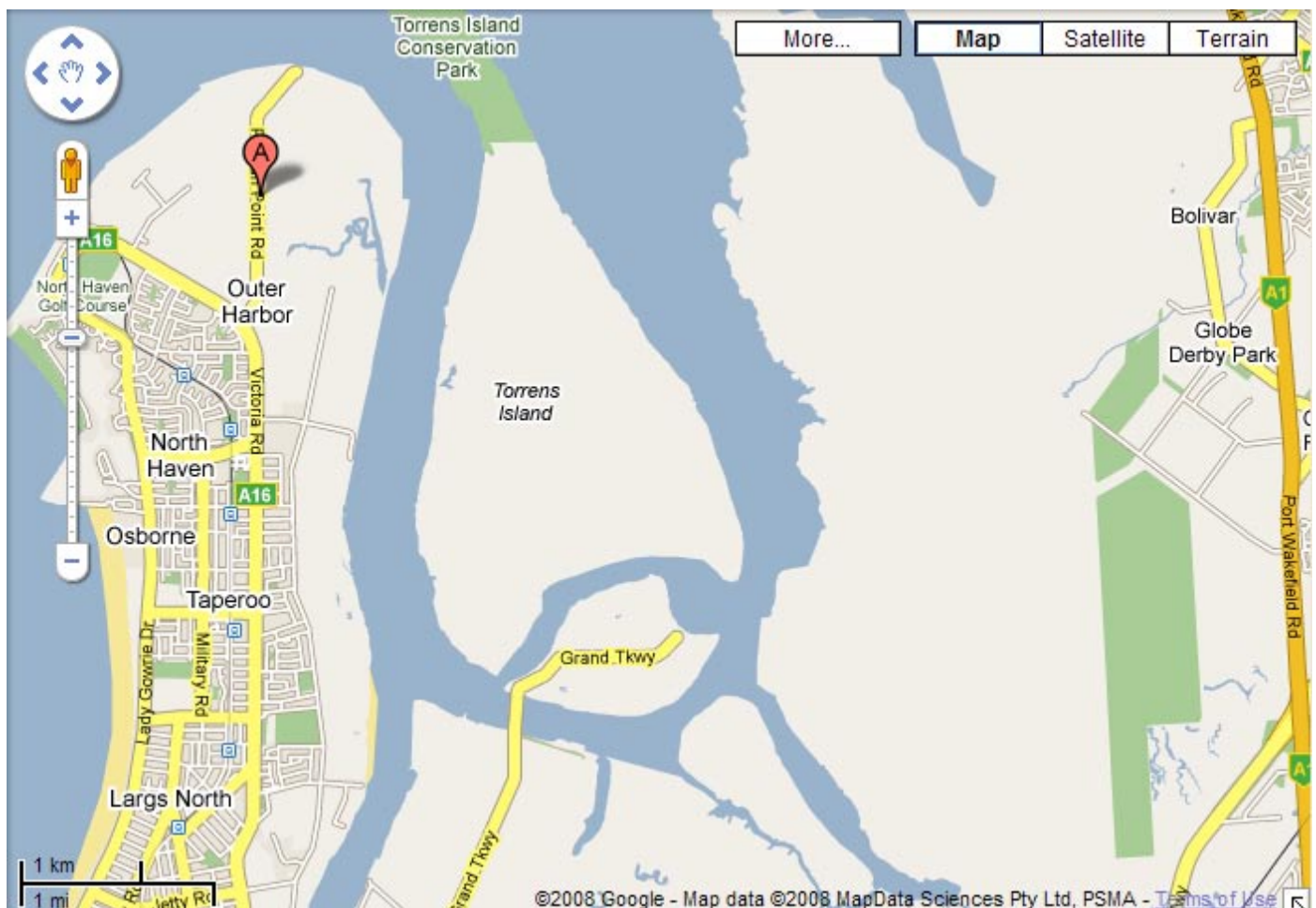
Step 3

Once you have received your confirmation letter, you will need to fax a list of **all people** attending the tour to **Desrae Falk** at Pelican Point: **Fax # (08) 8248 8899**.

This list will need to include the names of the students as well as teachers, volunteers and bus drivers (if they are coming into the plant for the tour). When you arrive you can check off the names of anyone who didn't turn up.

If this list is not received before the week of the tour, you may be refused entry to the site.

DRESS CODE FOR **STUDENTS AND ADULTS** **ATTENDING** **PELICAN POINT POWER STATION** **INDUSTRY TOURS**

ALL school students and **ALL** adults (including teachers, parents and bus drivers) entering the Pelican Point Power Station site **MUST** adhere to the following dress code.

- ALL - be wearing enclosed shoes. Sandals are not permitted.
- STUDENTS - be wearing a school uniform shirt with, at least, short sleeves and for
ADULTS - at least $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeves
- STUDENTS – be wearing school uniform skirt, shorts or trousers and for
- ADULTS at least $\frac{3}{4}$ pants

All adults and students will be given hard hats and safety glasses on arrival.

Entry will not be permitted unless the dress code is correct. This is a part of meeting our OHSW obligations and is not negotiable.
